- Critically review and Identify knowledge gaps in the WASH sector in Indonesia – important to find the issue, but equally important to discuss solutions & actions!
- Package research findings in a way that practitioner and decision makers could easily understand and act upon

# UNICEF's areas of collaboration with learning institutes

- Knowledge sharing with universities and students
- Joint assessment and survey with universities (e.g. 3M monitoring)
- Joint research / study
- Jointly informing WASH related curriculum to address capacity gaps in the sector
